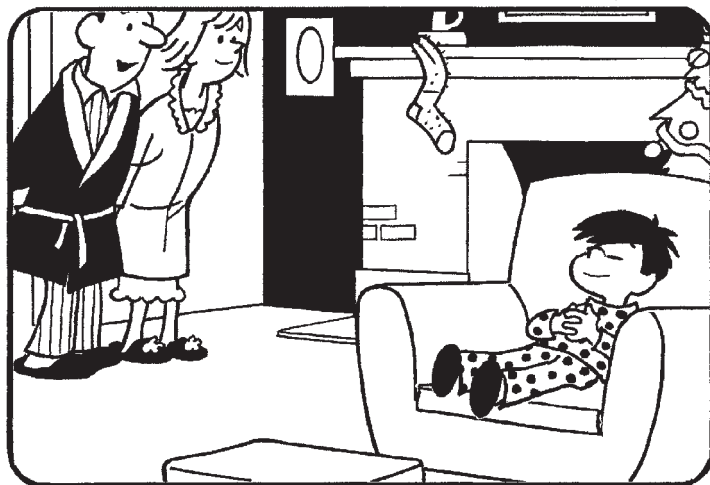

THE ALL-IN-ONE COOKIE DOUGH

Yield: 6 dozen
Total Time: 1 hour 25 minutes

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

In a large bowl, cream the butter and both sugars together. Add the baking soda and salt, then beat on high for

about 3 minutes until fluffy. Mix in the vanilla, until smooth. On low speed, gradually add the flour, about 1/2 cup at a time, until just combined. The dough will be soft. At this point, stir in your chosen mix-ins by hand and refrigerate the dough for 1 hour (minimum) to firm up and blend flavors.

At the time of baking: Preheat your oven to 375 F. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper. Drop heaping tablespoonfuls of dough onto a cookie sheet, spacing them about 3 inches apart. Bake for 9-11 minutes, until the edges are golden brown. Let cookies cool on the sheet for 2 minutes before transferring them to a cooling rack.
